

## Sexual Violence Resource Card for ESF Faculty and Staff

I'm glad you have come to talk to me and I want to help you the best way I can. Before you provide me with any information you may want to keep confidential, I am required by state law to make sure you understand my role.

- 1- I have an obligation to report the information you provide me (including names and relevant facts) to the College's Title IX Coordinator (or Deputy Title IX Coordinator) so you can become more fully informed about all the options and resources are available to you (including some of what I'm about to mention).
- 2- Do you need medical attention? Even if you don't want to talk to me, or are unsure right now, I can help you secure assistance from Counseling Services or a local hospital.
- 3- Regardless of whether you decide to share information with me, there are confidential resources available to you, both on campus (if you are a student) and off campus that can also provide some assistance to you.

- 4- You also always have the right and option to report to local law enforcement and/or the New York State Police, whether you talk to me or not. The College, through ESF University Police, can help facilitate that option if you would like and I can assist you in contacting ESF University Police.

Again, I hope you will choose to talk to me, but it is important that you understand the legal obligations that I am under.
