“Developing Disease Resistant American Chestnut Trees *217 Marshall Hall*

American chestnuts were one of the most common trees in the eastern forests of North America until an exotic pathogen was introduced over a century ago. Today it is rare to see a mature American chestnut tree due to the devastation of the chestnut blight. At SUNY-ESF, we have pursued the development of a disease-resistant tree using a biotechnology approach. Last year, we passed a major milestone that allows us to move our research from the lab into the field. Come find out more about this nationally renowned project!
