SUBJECT: 2009-10 Basketball Parking

The following procedures apply to parking on the ESF campus during Syracuse University basketball games at the Dome during the 2009-10 season:

Syracuse Police block off entry routes to the college from the west approximately two hours before the game. They suggest that we either enter through any SU gate or come to the checkpoint at Stadium Place and East Raynor to get to the Irving Avenue traffic control station. You must display your ESF parking pass in order to cross police checkpoints.

- (1) All normal parking regulations are in effect. Please do not block other vehicles, fire lanes or hydrants, building entrances, or park in restricted areas. Violators are subject to towing.
- (2) Any employee with a valid ESF parking pass and vehicle I.D. sticker will be admitted.
- (3) Employees with temporary parking passes will be admitted by displaying that pass and ESF identification.
- (4) Employees who will be coming to campus in a vehicle other than their own must obtain a special single game pass at the University Police Department in advance. Please bring your game tickets or a proof of purchase with your ESF ID card to the UPD office to obtain a game pass.
- (5) ESF students who need vehicle access for weekday evening classes, library, employment, or use of ESF educational facilities will be admitted after 5:00 P.M. During Saturday and Sunday games, the same regulations apply except for the time restriction. All student parking requires a valid ESF sticker. No student parking is permitted in the circle area outside Bray Hall.

- (6) The iron fence lot is reserved for handicapped parking under the control of SU Parking. The spaces north of Illick and visitors' spaces north of Bray are closed for safety reasons. **Employees who are parked in these spaces will need to move their vehicles at least two hours before the start of each game.**
- (7) Special passes will be available for official meetings and activities scheduled on the dates of home games. Please contact the University Police Department for further information. Early notification will facilitate the process.
- (8) For weekday home games, we will do our best to send out an email reminder the morning of the game. However, due to unforeseen staffing shortages, that may not always happen. **Please remember to check the College calendar or keep this memo as a reminder of basketball games that may coincide with your schedules.**
