Dr. Ganapin will also talk about the Global Environmental Fund (GEF) Small Grants Program which he manages for the United Nations in New York.

*Dr. Ganapin received his Ph.D. in Environmental Planning and Policy from ESF in 1987. Subsequently, he spent more than 10 years at the University of the Philippines' College of Forestry. He has done major work in strengthening the Philippine EIA system, particularly in the development of mechanisms supportive of local communities and indigenous peoples rights including the passage of that country's Indigenous Peoples Rights Act.*
