Master's Programs (M.S. or M.P.S.)

Our new Environmental Studies graduate program features:

- Key knowledge: core courses in sustainability, policy, governance, conflict resolution, advocacy, ethics, perception and behavior
- Breadth: a wide range of social science, humanities and science based courses related to the environment.
- Flexibility: individualized programs based on educational objectives are carefully planned around student backgrounds and needs
- Focus: students may choose a thematic focus to suit their career goals or may pursue a generalized plan of study
- Skills: courses to enhance critical, analytical, writing and communication skills

Through ESF's Graduate Program in Environmental Science, we offer the Ph.D. in the following areas:

We also offer a Ph.D. in Environmental and Natural Resources Policy that brings multiple biophysical sciences together with social science, policy, and management to examine managerial and policy solutions.

The Certificate Program in Environmental Decision Making is designed for graduate students enrolled in law, management, public administration, or information studies programs at Syracuse University. The Certificate of Advanced Study in Conflict Resolution allows students to engage in in-depth study of conflict theory, concepts and skills offered jointly with Syracuse University.

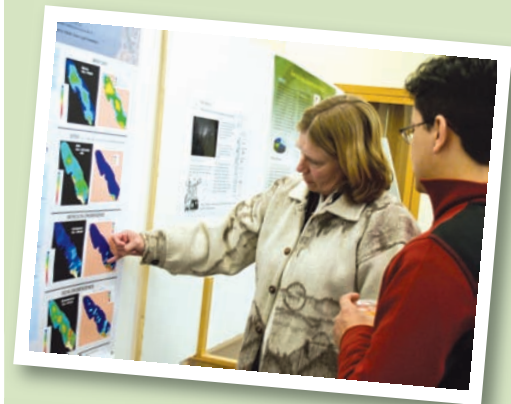
