



19TH ANNUAL GREAT LAKES RESEARCH CONSORTIUM STUDENT/FACULTY CONFERENCE

Call For Student Papers

The 19th annual Great Lakes Research Consortium Student-Faculty Conference will be held March 13-14, 2009 at the SUNY College of Environmental Science and Forestry in Syracuse, New York. Student presentations give students who are developing future research plans an opportunity to present their ideas to an audience of peers and faculty and can be either: 1) Results of ongoing or completed research, or 2) Research plans and proposals. Each presentation is followed by a short discussion.

There will be several sessions including:

- Social Science including Economics, Human Dimensions, Policy and Planning;
- Limnology and Ecology including Fisheries, Trophic Interactions, Ecosystem Modeling;
- Environmental Chemistry and Toxicology;
- Environmental Engineering and Modeling; and
- **Special Section:** Research on Areas of Concern.

Final session categories will be based on papers received.

All students presenting at the Conference will receive free registration, including meals at the luncheon and banquet. The best presentation in each category will receive a \$100 award. Travel support may be available from your GLRC Campus Representative.

Please submit an abstract of your research or proposed research by electronic mail as a Word document. Files should be named with the presenter's last name (e.g., dodson.doc), and include:

1. Title
2. Authors (Include student's advisor and any other contributors)
3. Institution (Name of School)
4. Address (Home Address, Street, City, State/Province, Zip)
5. Email, Phone
6. Session Preference (Chemistry, Engineering, Public Policy, Limnology, AOCs, etc.)
7. Presentation Format (Oral or Poster)
8. Abstract (not to exceed 250 words)

This year's plenary session will focus on Wind Energy and the Great Lakes. It will include several talks and a panel discussion on the ecological, economic, policy and industry implications of wind energy in the Great Lakes region.



Deadline for submission of abstracts is **February 15, 2009-March 1, 2009**. Notification of receipt will be made within 2 days after submission, and session placement will be available on February 22, 2009.
