ASSISTANTSHIP APPLICATION PROCEDURES
FOR
MATRICULATED GPES STUDENTS

- GPES Assistantships are awarded by semester / academic year, and may be partial awards.
- The award includes a stipend and a tuition scholarship.
- A full-time assistantship requires assisting 20 hours per week: which involves class, lab, tutoring students, grading papers, etc.
- Teaching Assistants are expected to participate in the Graduate Teaching Workshop, which is offered in late August - before classes begin.

Graduate Assistantships may be available for the following curriculum areas:

Submit:

1. A short, personal statement indicating the areas of the Environmental Science program elements above in which you feel capable of being a graduate assistant.
2. A current resume, including a list of extra-curricular activities, public service efforts, or funded efforts in which you have engaged.
3. A list of courses or college/departmental projects in which you have assisted.

The criteria used in awarding GPES Assistantships:

1. A grade point average of 3.5 or better.
2. The applicant's ability to handle assistantship assignments based on academic achievement.
3. Rankings will be made according to the applicants' qualifications to fill the vacant positions.
4. Prior efforts, demonstrated by extra curricular activities and public service, in addition to other items are considered to be positive indicators that support of the individual will be resources well invested.
