New York State Climate Leadership: The Climate Leadership and Community Protection Act

ABSTRACT

Global greenhouse gas emissions must approach zero by mid-century to avoid 1.5°C warming by 2100. In response, New York State has enacted the Climate Leadership and Community Protection Act, which requires reduction of economy-wide greenhouse gas emissions by 40% of their 1990 levels and by 85% by 2050. The Climate Action Council created by the CLCPA is required to develop a plan both to achieve these levels of emission reductions and to achieve carbon neutrality by sequestration of emissions equal to 15% of 1990 emission levels. This presentation will describe the CLCPA's statutory requirements, the prescribed planning process, the status of agency plans to lead planning, and strategies necessary to achieve required emission reductions.
