

SAF Minutes from April 21, 2003

- Tree Planting (headed by Travis) has picked up the seedlings. They are about 3 feet tall. A problem we have is protecting the seedlings from rodents and deer. Travis met with Dick Schwab and Dr. Maynard. All together they suggested
 1. mats, but they only protect the seedlings from matts
 2. tree protectors that are 60 inches high for deer browse and rodent girdling
 3. "deer off" liquid and spray seedlings, but it doesn't protect against all rodents

2. May 3rd – major planting day
3. May 9th – planting with the school kids
