



## SUNY Conversations in the Disciplines:

### The Feasibility of a NYS Energy Conservation/Global Warming Consortium

SUNY will host a consortium on September 19, 2003 on the ESF campus in the Alumni Lounge located in Marshall Hall. The event is called, "Conversation in the Disciplines Event: The Feasibility for a New York State Energy Conservation/Global Warming Consortium".
