Dear colleagues:

Continuing education is now required for all landscape architects to renew their registration in New York State. The triennial requirement for 36 hours of acceptable continuing education will be prorated at the rate of 1 hour of continuing education per month starting with January 1, 2007. For example, if your registration is due for renewal in February, 2007, you will need to have completed 2 hours of acceptable continuing education.

The New York Upstate Chapter of ASLA and SUNY ESF are providing you with an opportunity to earn **2 hours of continuing education** on **Friday, February 23, 2007**. The course, "**NYS Building Code - Anticipated Changes & Site Provisions**" will run from 3:00 to 5:00 pm and be taught by Laura M Cooney, RA/AIA. Ms. Cooney has over 13 years of experience in architecture, project management, and code training, and has specifically designed this course to prepare landscape architects and related design professionals for the transition to the new building codes in New York State. The course is an AIA CES course under the Health, Safety, & Welfare (HSW) topic (as it will cover codes); it should be applicable to site engineers and architects, as well as landscape architects (HSW credits are also considered acceptable for PDH credits in NYS).

In addition to this continuing education course, there are several other exciting events scheduled for February 23 at SUNY ESF. We invite you to attend the Executive Committee meeting of the NY Upstate Chapter of ASLA, starting at 1:00 pm in Room 327, Marshall Hall. The continuing education course will be followed by a reception with an opportunity to network with students and professionals, and to learn more about our sponsor, Unilock. The Landscape Architecture Program at SUNY ESF will present the George F. Earle lecture, by Ricardo Dumont, Principal at Sasaki Associates, at 7:00 pm, followed by the Festival of Places. All events take place in Marshall Hall on the SUNY ESF campus in Syracuse.

Directions:

From the West and North:

Thruway to Exit 36/Route 81. Take Route 81 South to the Adams/Harrison Streets exit (#18). Follow signs to Adams Street (under underpass) and turn left onto Adams (one way heading east). At the second light (top of the hill/after Health Science Center) take a right onto Irving Avenue. Follow Irving Avenue, the Dome will be on your left side. Take a right onto East Raynor Avenue the last street before entering the campus. Take the next right onto Stadium Place. Turn right into the parking garage.

From the East:

As above, OR-- Thruway to Exit 34A/Route 690. Take Route 690 West (sign for Fairgrounds) to Exit 13 Townsend Street/Downtown. Turn left onto Townsend and follow (about one mile) to Adams Street (one-way heading east). Once you have gone under the underpass for Route 81, take a right at the second light (top of the hill/ after Health Science Center) take a right onto Irving Avenue. Follow Irving Avenue, the Dome will be on your left side. Take a right onto East Raynor Avenue the last street before entering the campus. Take the next right onto Stadium Place. Turn right into the parking garage.

From the South:

Follow Route 81 North to Exit 18/Adams Street. Turn right onto Adams Street (one way heading east). At the second light (top of the hill/ after Health Science Center) take a right onto Irving Avenue. Follow Irving Avenue, the Dome will be on your left side. Take a right onto East Raynor Avenue the last street before entering the campus. Take the next right onto Stadium Place. Turn right into the parking garage.
