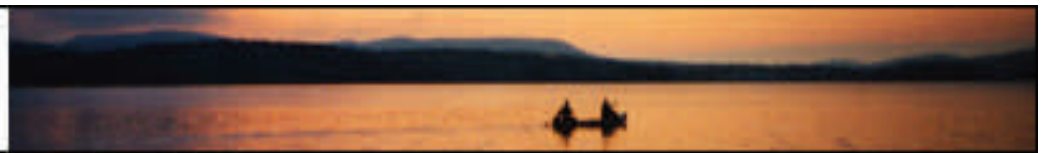

THE WORLD OF ADIRONDACK MOSSES; A WORKSHOP FOR BEGINNERS

Who should come? The workshop will be of interest to all beginners interested in mosses. This two day workshop offers an introduction to the miniature world of mosses of the Adirondack region. The program includes a combination of guided field walks through diverse Adirondack habitats and evening sessions in the laboratory with skilled teachers. You are invited to learn to identify common mosses of the Adirondacks, using hand lens and microscope, and to explore the ecology of these fascinating plants.



The course is taught by **Dr. Robin Kimmerer**, professor of moss ecology and author of “Gathering Moss: A natural and cultural history of mosses”.
