Rationale: This revision is being implemented per the 2021 guidance on SUNY General Educational Framework (<u>SUNY General Education Framework (SUNY GE) - SUNY</u>) to incorporate a general education requirement in diversity, equity, and social justice (DEISJ; <u>https://system.suny.edu/academic-affairs/acaproplan/general-education/suny-ge/</u>). This revision is required to be implemented by Fall 2024 for A.A.S. degree programs. For the Environmental and Natural Resources A.A.S. program, the new DEISJ requirement will replace the formerly required social science (economics/policy/government) course required for the degree program.

The freshman year environmental and natural resources conservation curriculum consists of general studies courses which may be taken at any accredited four-year, community, or agricultural college, or college of technology. All General Education courses (denoted with a 'G' in the table below) are expected to be completed prior to beginning the Ranger School year.

The ESF Ranger School delivers the A.A.S. degree in Environmental and Natural Resources Conservation during one extended (44-credit) academic year. All students enrolled in this program are expected to complete 20 prerequisite credits prior to attending the ESF Ranger School. Thus, students entering the Ranger School are transfer students. Because transfer students are expected to meet the General Education Framework in place at the time of their transfer (in this case, Fall 2024), this change will apply to all students entering the ESF Ranger School starting in the 2024-25 academic year.

- AY 2023-24: Planning and Transition
 - Ranger School Director prepares curriculum revision for submission on or before January 15, 2024 to meet the 2021 SUNY General Educational Framework revision for Fall 2024.
 - The revision described herein was discussed and approved by Ranger School faculty during their Fall start-up meeting in August 2023.
 - This pending change was shared with SUNY ESF Admissions staff during the September 2023 In-Service training, so that they may begin counseling students accordingly.
 - Counseling: Students who are planning to attend the ESF Ranger School in AY 2024-25 or thereafter will be counseled to take a DEISJ course in place of the formerly required social science prerequisite. All other prerequisite courses remain as published.
- AY 2024-25: Full Implementation
 - Students planning to attend the ESF Ranger School in AY 2024-25 and thereafter will be required to take a DEISJ course in addition to other prerequisites to receive their A.A.S. degree. This will ensure they meet the minimum of the four specifically required knowledge and skills areas.
