- 1. Call to Order 11:05
- 2. Updates from the Associate Provost
 - a. CPL Policy will be coming soon. Please be prepared to review
 - b. Students are still taking SU courses, despite fee. There are about 300 students in SU courses besides Physics, and only about a third applied for a waiver.
 - c. There will be a review of the policy on transferring credit from undergraduate to graduate programs coming soon, and how many credits can double count between the two. Suggested 9 credits max. This could help develop 4+1 programs.
 - i. Question: Does that mean they would be given graduate credit for a shared resource course that they didn't enroll in grad credit for?
 - 1. No, they would enroll in graduate courses their last year/semester that can be applied to both grad and undergrad to shorten the timeline for degree for grad program.
 - ii. Question about allowing 700-level courses having undergraduates.
 - 1. They would not be in upper-level grad as part of this pathway

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- d. Once all Physics courses are approved at ESF, we will provide a memo or blanket curriculum proposal to accept EPH courses in place of the SU versions.
- 3. Old Business
 - a. Committee charge

Current: This committee is charged with all matters of the College's instructional program.
