#### January 19<sup>th</sup>

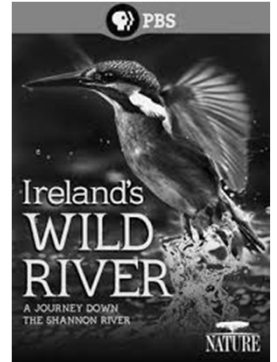
##### H is for Hawk

#### February 2<sup>nd</sup>

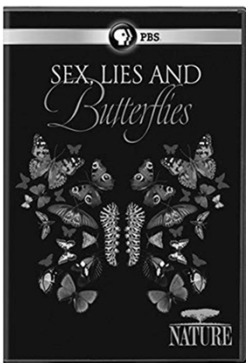
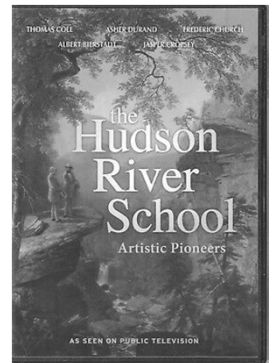
##### Leave it to Beavers
