- Medication
- Shower caddy/bucket
- Shower shoes/sandals

WHAT NOT TO BRING

- X Mini fridge/microwave (we provide these for you!)
- Cooking appliances: air fryers, ovens, hotplates, toasters, toaster ovens, crock-pots, grills (including "George Foreman-type" grills) and other similar devices
- Nails, Command Strips, duct tape, or other hangers that will cause damage
- x Flushable wipes
- × Space heaters
- x Candles, incense, etc.
- x Wall-mounted TVs (only free-standing TVs are permitted)
- **x** Firearms, weapons, and fireworks
- Ceneral-purpose extension cords (even UL-approved; only UL-listed grounded power strips with built-in fuse circuit breaker are permitted)
- Halogen lamps and multi-head floor lamps
- x Large pieces of furniture
- x Pets
- Expensive or irreplaceable collectibles or jewelry
