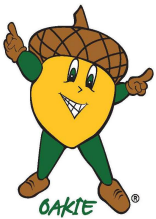


Federal lunch status

The ESF in the High School program offers a fee discount for students who are eligible for the Federal Free and Reduced Lunch program. 27% of the students qualified.

35 high schools across New York State participated in the program.

Most popular course



Most of our partner schools offered EFB120: Introduction to Global Environment, in which 337 students participated. Second to that was ESF122: Environmental Economics with 108 students. Other courses included math offerings, general biology, English and writing, environmental ethics, government, introduction to renewal energy, research and paper science engineering.



Research credits

Students are able to participate in additional research opportunities outside of their courses for credit either at their high school or at the ESF main campus. 16 students earned college credit working on research projects.



ESFHS Students

The program is holding strong and steady with over 650 students registered. At some schools, students can take more than one course each year. One high school in the program offers 7 distinct offerings.
