To help you prepare for your important position, you are invited to the Graduate Assistant Colloquium on Teaching and Learning. Although the Colloquium is specifically designed to prepare Graduate Assistants (GAs) for their instructional support roles, we have come to realize that many portions of the Colloquium pertain to graduate fellows and will provide you with essential campus resource information and a network of other Fellows, Research Project Assistants, GAs, faculty and staff. Moreover, our experience indicates that graduate students often find themselves in a GA role over the course of their graduate study. Participation now would also fulfill your requirement should you be hired as a GA in future semesters.

I believe you will find the Colloquium to be a valuable professional development experience that will serve you in the short-term, as well as throughout your graduate study and beyond. This is a unique opportunity to become part of a diverse and talented group of people who share a commitment to excellence in teaching, research and outreach.

The Colloquium will continue to be run as a hybrid model this year, with an asynchronous online portion to be completed on Blackboard along with a one day in person event. ESF is planning to resume classes on Monday, August 28, 2023. This means that the Colloquium will be **the week of August 21**, which coincides with your first week of GA appointment. There will be a mandatory, in-person event on **Wednesday**, **August 23**, **from 9am – 4pm in Moon Library** on the ESF Syracuse campus. To receive credit for completion, you will need to attend the in-person event and complete all assigned tasks online **by noon on Friday**, **August 25**. Details are still being worked out and are subject to change, so we ask that you <u>register</u> for the Colloquium now so that we may contact you with updates as we proceed.

We will use <u>Blackboard</u> for the online resources and activities, and it is how we will monitor completion. If you are unfamiliar, or need a refresher, the Open Academy has created a series of <u>Blackboard Trainings</u>, which are aimed at faculty, but beneficial for GA's as well. We would direct you specifically to the "Getting Started in Blackboard" folder.

To prepare, please review the enclosed document and complete the <u>registration</u> as soon as possible. This registration will also be how we add participants to the Blackboard course. Please feel free to contact me with any questions you may have.
