**SPPF SCHOLARSHIPS
FOR UNDERGRADUATE STUDENTS
IN PAPER SCIENCE OR PAPER ENGINEERING
AT
THE SUNY COLLEGE OF ENVIRONMENTAL SCIENCE AND FORESTRY.**

The Syracuse Pulp and Paper Foundation, Inc. (SPPF) awards scholarships to undergraduate students enrolled in Paper Science or Paper Engineering at the SUNY College of Environmental Science and Forestry. SPPF scholarships are based on academic merit, and awards vary based on class level and cumulative grade point average. Scholarships are renewed each semester, subject to the approval of the SPPF Board of Directors.

1. Students must be enrolled in Paper Science or Paper Engineering at SUNY College of Environmental Science and Forestry and demonstrate satisfactory progress toward a BS degree in Paper Science or Paper Engineering as defined by the Department of Paper and Bioprocess Engineering in consultation with the SPPF Scholarship Committee and Board of Directors.
2. Scholarships are available to US citizens and permanent residents. Others may be considered at the discretion of the Foundation, depending on availability of funds. The SUNY ESF Director of Business Affairs determines residency.

Students will qualify based on completed course credits, at the first day of classes each semester, as Freshmen, Sophomore, Junior or Senior class.

1. Freshmen enrolled in Paper Science or Paper Engineering will be awarded \$500 per semester for up to 2 semesters.
2. Sophomores enrolled in Paper Science or Paper Engineering that carry a GPA of 2.0 or above, will be awarded \$3,200 per semester, for two semesters.
3. Juniors, Seniors and fifth year Seniors enrolled in Paper Science or Paper Engineering will be awarded on a semester by semester basis, per the student's Cumulative Grade Point Average (GPA) as identified below.

Cumulative GPA Requirements for SPPF Awards (Semester 5+)

GPA	NYS Residents	Out-of-state students (add \$750)
3.250 – 4.000	\$3200	\$3950
3.000 – 3.249	\$2350	\$3100
2.500 – 2.999	\$1730	\$2480

4. For students enrolled less than full time (12 credit hours per semester), the above rules apply on a prorated basis for those registered for 6 hours up to 12 hours. For students registered for less than 6 credit hours per semester no scholarship will be awarded in that semester.

Please note that the scholarship program may be changed per the recommendation of the Foundation's Scholarship Committee and the approval of the SPPF Board of Directors. Awards may vary from semester to semester according to available resources.
