

WHAT IS TIMBUCTOO

The Timbuctoo Institute, founded in 2023, is a summer interdisciplinary program hosting high school sophomores and juniors from systemically marginalized communities. From Brooklyn to the Hudson Valley to Syracuse to the Adirondacks, students explore climate science through a lens of environmental and social justice while learning about academic and professional career opportunities in these fields and at their intersections.

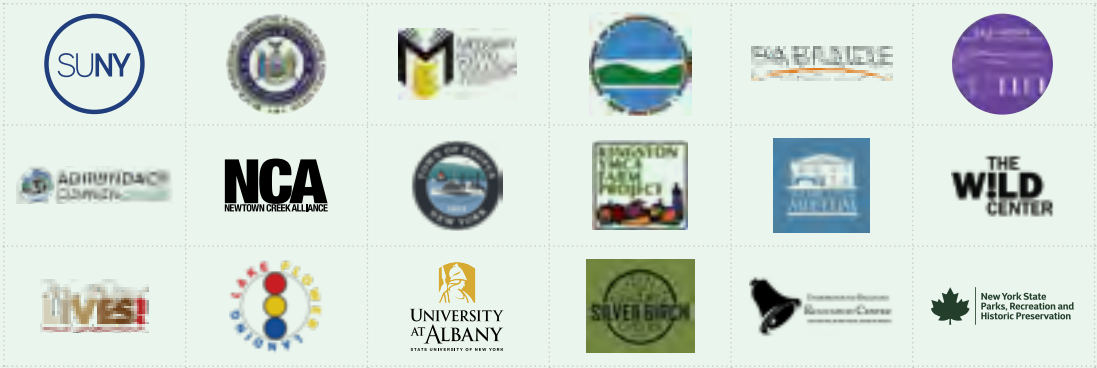
Director's Message

The Timbuctoo Institute was inspired by an 1846 “scheme of justice” granting land to free black men in order to create equal access to the vote. 180 years later, the Timbuctoo Institute is designed to provide equal access to careers, and the paths to prepare for those careers. We cannot hope to solve the challenges facing our society if we are not including the best and the brightest in our efforts to change our world for the better. And if we are not creating pathways for all to access the career fields at the forefront of addressing climate science, and environmental and social justice, then we can never hope to truly create a more equal and just society.

The Timbuctoo Institute Experience

Students begin their journey in Brooklyn, NY. They follow the Hudson River to Kingston and from there they travel to Syracuse before making their way north to spend a week in the Adirondack Mountains.

Over two weeks, students are immersed in hands-on activities, experiential learning, and guided exploration, all under the mentorship of college faculty, researchers, staff, and students from SUNY ESF and CUNY Medgar Evers College (MEC), the core institute partners.



What We Have Accomplished

In the first two years, Timbuctoo hosted 88 students from across all five Boroughs. Over those two years, we increased applications by more than 100%, and increased participation from 41 of 48 spaces in the inaugural year to 48 of 48 in our second. Our second year also expanded our reach, and Timbuctoo Institute has now hosted students from 45 different high schools, representing connections to almost 10% of NYC high schools.

Valuing Time Too

Recognizing many students use summer break to earn money for college and not wanting to diminish that important effort, the Timbuctoo Institute provides a stipend to every participant who successfully completes the program. The stipend of \$1,280 for 40 hours in each of two weeks matches the minimum wage rate for NYC.



Lasting Connections

The bonds we build with participants during each session extend beyond the time we are together, and the Institute is committed to being more than just a two-week summer experience. We strive to maintain a connection to alumni, sharing local opportunities to be engaged, facilitating connections with contacts from summer, and creating events bringing together alumni and former staff around comradery, content, and careers.

Alumni Events

New this past year, in September we organized for alumni to attend a Climate Education conference in Lower Manhattan during Climate Week. Over the winter months we host an Institute Reunion, drawing well over 50% of alumni, and we organized an Albany Excursion also drawing a high level of participation. The excursion is a two-day trip where we visit SUNY Albany and their Atmospheric Sciences Research Center, meet with professionals from NYS Parks and the Underground Railroad Education Center, and spend a day in the State Capitol learning the civic process while meeting with legislators.
