Valuing Time Too

Many students use summer break to earn money for college. The Timbuctoo Institute values that important effort and so provides a stipend to participants who complete the program, time they could have instead been working. The stipend of \$1,280 for 40 hours in two weeks matches the minimum wage rate for New York City.








Timbuctoo Institute Research Program

The Timbuctoo Institute Research Program (TIRP) complements the Institute's work by providing monitoring and evaluation support to assess the program's effectiveness on our participants, partners, and staff. In keeping with the Institute's mission to provide and support professional development opportunities, TIRP supports academic and non-academic research through a collaborative and inclusive framework. This includes supporting directed graduate student projects, providing additional levels of access, awareness, and opportunity.

The TIRP designs research projects that seek to advance our understanding of how different experiences of places and culture informs the Institute's success inspiring participants to expand their personal and professional goals. Through our program evaluation we are better able to understand participants relations with, and perceptions of, land, community, environment, and governance structures within the context of social equity, inclusion and justice, and awareness of career pathways.

Research Projects

Assessing Partnerships within the Timbuctoo Ecosystem

Researcher | Madeline Squarcia, MS Student

This project seeks to understand how partnerships with the Timbuctoo Institute impact the planning and delivery of environmental and related content by program providers and educators within the Timbuctoo ecosystem.

Research Question How is partnering with the Timbuctoo Institute influencing the content and methodologies of programming partners, and influencing their approach to their work in the climate and social justice fields?

PLANNED/FUTURE

Longitudinal Assessment of the Impact of Participation on Timbuctoo Alumni

This project seeks to determine if, and how much of an impact, Timbuctoo has on the educational and career trajectories of Timbuctoo alumni. This is done through evaluation of the program on participants' decisions about education, careers, and involvement in environmental and climate action in the years following their enrollment.

Research Question Are the educational and career choices of Timbuctoo alumni attributable to their participation in the program?







Ongoing Research

Program Evaluation of the Timbuctoo Institute Summer Programs

Researcher | Alexandra Walls, M.S. '25

The goal of this project was to develop an evaluation program to assess impacts to participants' climate, environmental, and social justice knowledge as well as awareness of career pathways.



What was done | Surveys have been administered at the beginning and end of each session for each year of the program. These surveys include questions about knowledge of climate science and social justice careers participants were exposed to, and how participants' identities might be impacted.

What we learned | In year two, the total mean knowledge score increased from before to after the program, with the percentage of correct responses nearly doubling for all justice-focused knowledge questions. The survey responses also indicate significant changes in how the participants see themselves as part of nature.

Why this is important | We are able to see from this data that we are impacting the participant's knowledge in the areas of climate and justice, broadening their understanding of possible career pathways, and identifying positive changes in the participant's environmental identity and behaviors. These findings indicate that the Timbuctoo Institute is delivering on its mission and goals to provide a learning environment within a broader transformative experience. The findings also suggest the environmental literacy and climate commitments of NYS would benefit greatly from including environmental, climate and social justice in the core education curriculum.

Overall, the Timbuctoo Institute hopes to have a positive influence on educational opportunities in New York state, which will see the broadening of participation of historically oppressed groups in higher education and environmental careers.










Expansion Plans
