Clean Water, Clean Air and Green Jobs Environmental Bond Act

\$4 billion for the single purpose of making environmental improvements that preserve, enhance, and restore New York's natural resources and reduce the impact of climate change by funding capital projects

Not less than,

Restoration and Flood Risk Reduction - \$1.2 billion Water Quality Improvement and Resilient Infrastructure - \$650 million

Up to,

Open Space land conservation = \$650 million Climate Change Mitigation \$1.1 billion (\$350 million for green buildings)


